Nadrasca Wins Whitehorse Business Group Award

In July, Nadrasca entered the Whitehorse Business Group Awards, in the new 'Community Award' category, included to recognise the contribution that the Not-for-Profit and Community Sector make to the City of Whitehorse.

Community organisations supporting people with a disability need to explore new paradigms of inclusion and align themselves with asset-based community development strategies. Participation and Integration outline the obligation of service providers to assist people with a disability to integrate, participate and be involved in the life of the community. Inclusion is regularly mentioned as the outcome. Whilst **integration** is thought of as having a presence (with an understanding that this presence may lead to opportunities), the concept of **inclusion** is sometimes difficult to define.

Inclusion:

- Is not a disability issue. Inclusion is a community issue. Other members of our community experience exclusion and wish to experience inclusion.
- Is increased in the community not by education programs, but by approaching the community from a perspective of possibility and invitation and enlisting people to participate in ways that make sense to them. If more people participated in the process, more would own the commitment.
- Has three components: being there, feeling like you belong there and being missed if you were not there.

Extract from a presentation at the 43rd ASSID (Australian Society for the Study of Intellectual Disability) Conference by Anne Marie O'Brien

On 29 September, Nadrasca Community staff attended the Personalised Lifestyle Assistance workshop on the Art of Relationships. As we seek to enrich the lives of people with a disability, we are uncertain about how to involve and engage others not paid to be there. Families are worried about who will be there in the future; hence many put their hopes in the services system.

At Nadrasca Community, we are striving to **Evolve our Service Delivery**.

We aim to:

- Create opportunities and build freely-given relationships
- Focus on individual contributions which can lead to better communities for all of us
- Invite and nurture relationships in people's lives
- Create relationships that can safeguard people's lives

- Build circles of support which can develop and assist people to live the lives they want
- Facilitate and nourish people's efforts

In the past, we have concentrated on the activities of groups within Programs and people had to 'fit the model'. Now, we are moving to focus our efforts on intentional relationship building. We need to assist individuals with a disability to pick up on social cues, learning to advance a friendship in a way that occurs naturally for many people. The role of the Keyworker needs to be valued as a means of enhancing people's connections.

Have you had your Personal Plan created? If not, contact your Keyworker.

Changes to Nadrasca Community Options Service Delivery (Witt Street & High Street)

On 7 November, Service Delivery across High Street and Witt Street changed in another move towards true empowerment.

The aim is for people with a disability to spend time with their Keyworker, really getting to know each other. We now have two flexible days (High St: Mon and Tues; Witt St: Tues and Fri), where the Keyworker gets to know the person they support and assists in the development of their individual Personal Plan. The quality and type of information in Personal Plans will provide us with a better understanding of people's hopes, wishes, dreams, likes/dislikes and aspirations.

It's about providing opportunities and experiences with people to pursue their passions, interests, likes, dreams and goals in their Personal Plans, rather than just a focus on programs. People will be supported to access and take part in a variety of activities in their local community.

The Music Theatre Group (Witt St & High St) is busy rehearsing for the 2012 production, 'Chicago'. A fun-filled Trivia Night was held in November to raise funds for this production. Thank you to **Rhonda Hussey** and her team of supporters for their hard work in organising this and seeking donations from local businesses and staff, who

were more than generous. The night was a rousing success and in total, over \$4,000 was raised.


Meghan's Engagement
